**Prior to Travel**

**VACCINES:** Ugandan authorities require yellow fever certificate for all passengers entering the country. The certificate can be issued by your health-care provider.

**VISA:** Nationals from the following countries do not require a visa: Members of COMESA (i.e. Burundi, Comoros, Kenya, Mauritius, Seychelles, Tanzania, Zimbabwe), The Bahamas, Jamaica, Sierra Leone.

For all other participants, PGA will soon transmit to you the letter issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Uganda to allow you to travel and obtain the visa upon arrival in Uganda. In case there is a Ugandan Embassy or Consulate in your country, you may use the same visa-letter and the PGA invitation letter to obtain a visa before your departure. The visa at the Consulate and at the Airport should be gratis. In case you are asked to pay, please keep the receipt of payment. PGA will refund it to you.

If you will obtain your visa upon arrival in Kampala, you will be requested 2 passport photos

**BOARDING PASSES and RECEIPTS:** If PGA funded your flight, please conserve the original (economy) Boarding Passes of your flights to reach Kampala (Donor's regulations request PGA to maintain original documentation of flights funded by the organization). If you are upgraded to business class, please request the airline to allow you conserve the economy boarding pass for our records.
